- The SEC Renewable Energy Park will be Victoria's first 100% publicly owned utilityscale renewable energy project.
- It is estimated to cost around AU\$370 million (US\$240 million) to develop fully and is being constructed around 300km northwest of the state capital, Melbourne, in Horsham.
